Entry Graduate Student Assistantship (GSA)

Academic Year 2017-2018 > Fall, Spring, and Summer Semesters

An incoming student approved for an Entry GSA may receive three consecutive trimesters of GSA. A total of nine credits of Entry GSA with equivalent tuition credit are available in any academic year; continuing eligibility is based on the GSA remaining in good standing in matters of academic integrity and GPA.

Teaching and Research GSA: Assistance with CACREP needs, article submissions on various topics, MACC newsletter, Social Media, course design, and course prep.

Skills Required: Blackboard, Excel, Word, PowerPoint, and other computer skills to assist with teaching and research requests, knowledge of counseling field; organizational skills.

In order to be eligible for an Entry GSA, a student must have a cumulative GPA of 3.7 or higher. The Office of Academic Dean will review transcripts provided in the admissions process to determine eligibility. The applicant must provide a letter of reference from a former professor, pastor, or employer describing suitability of the applicant for a GSA. The letter may be provided by email to academicdept@winebrenner.edu by the individual providing the reference or by mail Attention: Office of the Academic Dean Entry GSA. The letter of reference must be received by August 1 for the applicant to be considered.

It should be noted one Entry GSA position will be awarded in each academic year. Individuals who have not yet been admitted to the seminary may apply for the Entry GSA position. The GSA will be awarded to a matriculated student in the Clinical Counseling program. **Applications will be accepted until August 1st.**
