



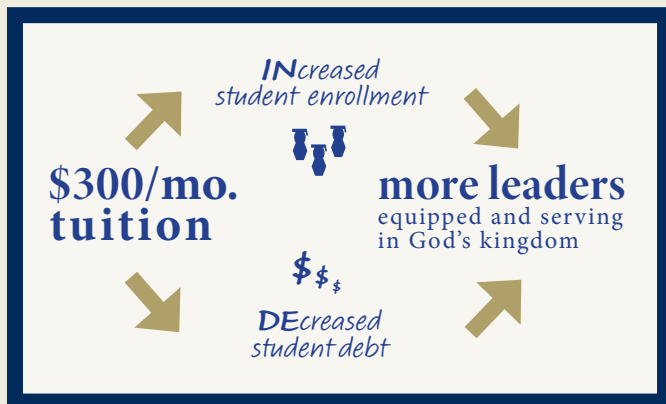
MAJOR ANNOUNCEMENT BY PRESIDENT SLEASMAN

Historic Board Decision for Greater Kingdom Impact

In 2020, Winebrenner Seminary was the recipient of a grant from the CARES Act Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund. That money was used to offset tuition for the current academic year, bringing student cost to \$300/month.

I am pleased to announce that on Friday, February 19, 2021, Winebrenner's Board of Trustees took a historic vote that is intended to remove the financial obstacle for many students. The members affirmed that **Winebrenner's tuition will be \$300/month for any student enrolled in a graduate program, starting with the fall 2021 trimester.**

As pictured here below, our team's proposal to the Board was written with the belief that this decision will lead to 1) increased student enrollment and 2) the equipping of more leaders for service within God's kingdom.



While the cost of education in the United States continues to increase, this move is intentionally designed to lessen the financial burden on students as they pursue God's call on their lives.

As part of this decision, we are trusting that those who financially and prayerfully support Winebrenner will continue to see the tremendous value of their kingdom



investment. When I shared our Board's decision with a friend who serves as president of another seminary, she exclaimed, "What a remarkable investment in current and future students!"

This shift to a \$300/month tuition rate is a positive change, one that will lead to greater Christian leaders serving in our cities, communities, and around the world. Through this transition and the many that have come before, our team's deep purpose has remained constant: to assist students in their pursuit of Jesus and their service to Him.

At this point in our Seminary's history, we are confident of our future. More importantly, we have confidence in the God who is in control of both our present and our future. As the writer of Hebrews reminds us, "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever" (13:8).

When the announcement came out about the new \$300/month rate, my phone started buzzing as every member of my [counseling] cohort started giving praise to God. Who would have thought that buzzing phones could be praise songs?!

Winebrenner donors, thank you a million times over for this opportunity to build my skillset so that God can use me fully in my gifts!

I am already a pastor (20 years!) but have always felt that my counseling skills were sub-par. My experience in ministry plus the additional licensure in counseling will allow me to serve the people God loves in new and needed ways. I've imagined what it would be like to work full time in counseling to pay the bills while serving a church who can't afford a pastor. I've wondered what it would be like to minister to pastors and others who struggle with mental health issues or simply have had a bad experience in the church. God might just send me to the people who are longing to be loved and known and understood, using me in the local church as well as allowing counseling to reach those who will never set foot in a church.

In January of 2020 God called me into the classroom of Global Vision Christian School PA Campus as the Biblical Studies teacher for international senior high students. Having a Bachelors of Arts of Religious Studies was not going to be enough in the classroom, nor enough to help with the Ministry Training Institute established by the Eastern Regional Conference of the CGGC. My prayer to God was that if this is where He called me, I would need for Him to supply the master's degree. **This was going to take a miraculous act of God, since there were no extra finances in our budget.**

When Winebrenner announced the \$300/month plan, it was an answer to my prayers. I was unsure what I would do once the limited program ended, but knew God had brought me this far. Hearing that the decision was made to make the \$300/month program permanent is a blessing I cannot praise God for enough. It is something I will let everyone know about and encourage them that seminary education is not just for pastors and Christian professionals; it is for anyone looking to go deeper in Scripture and grow in their faith.

Students Share Impact of New Tuition Rate

“PRAISE GOD! I felt such relief and joy [at the news of the \$300/month tuition rate] that I was not sure what to do except shout the good words from the rooftops. I immediately started singing the hymn “How Great Thou Art.” Then I began thanking God profusely for answering my prayers. I did not know how I would manage to continue my seminary training without a significant reduction in the normal tuition rates. But he called me to the ministry and led me to Winebrenner.

My children and grandchildren are excited that I am attending seminary. My older great grandchildren think it is exciting that I am going to be a minister like our pastor. I think my kids are relieved by the tuition reduction because they will not have any need to worry about whether I am eating or paying tuition. Seriously, they are incredibly happy for me because they know I am dedicated to what I am doing and would find a way to complete what God has called me to do. At this point I feel drawn to small group ministry with single moms.”
